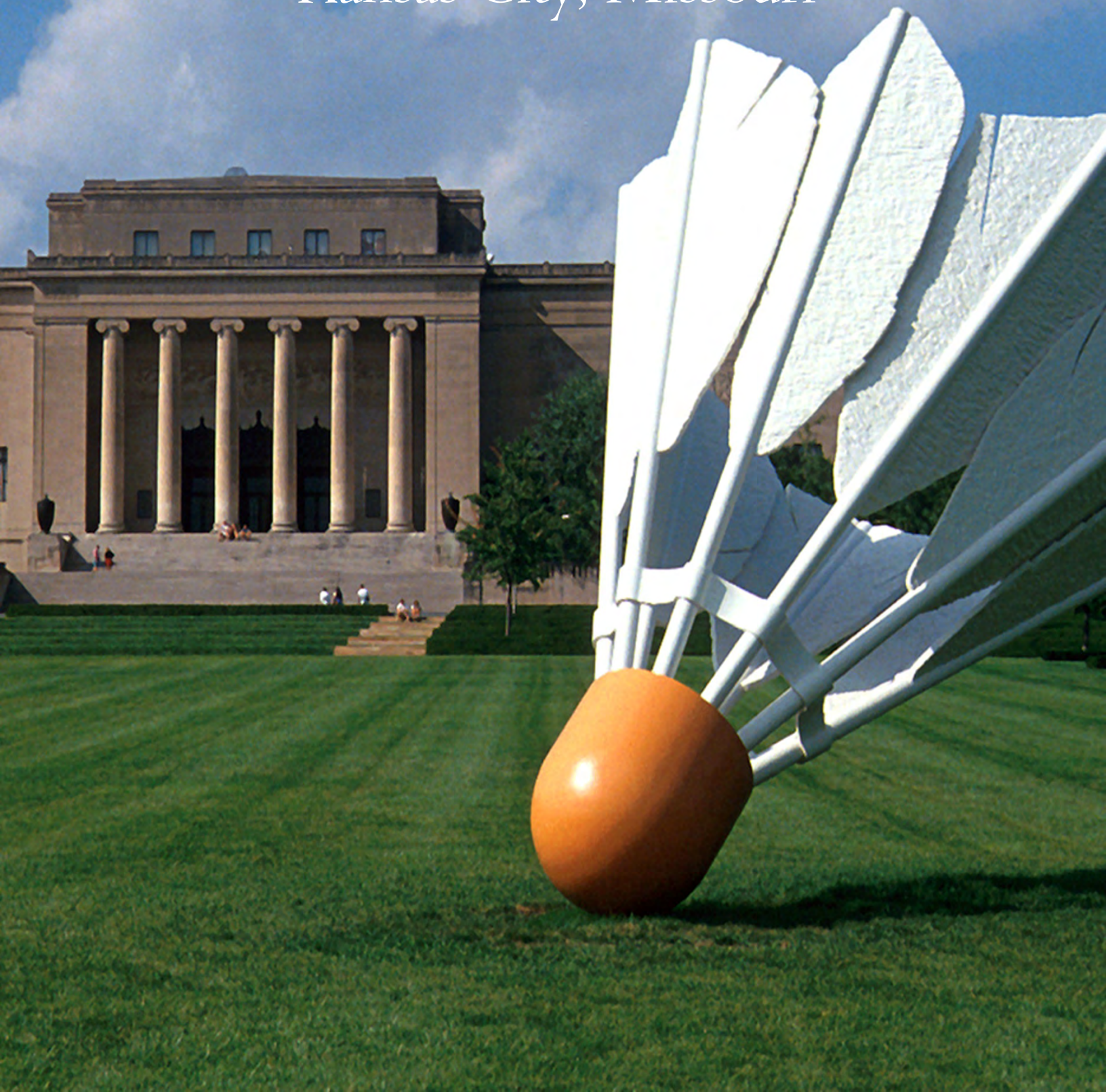

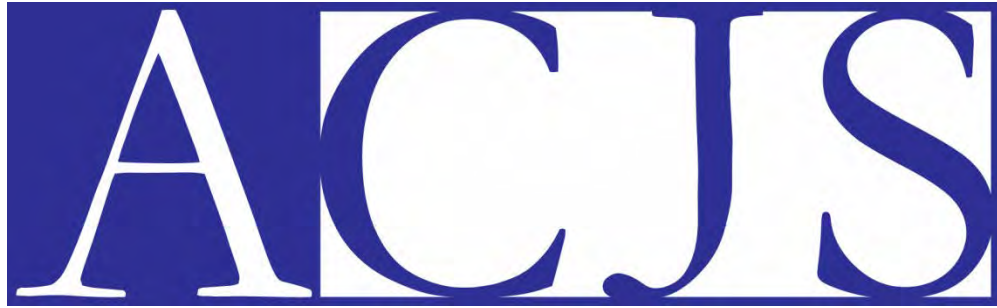

**Pursuant to the ACJS Code of Ethics and ACJS Policies,

Any organization hosting an event in an ACJS meeting room or any Annual Meeting attendee assumes entire responsibility and hereby agrees to protect, indemnify, defend, and save ACJS and its employees, officers, volunteers, and representatives from and against all claims, losses, and damages to persons or property, governmental charges or fines, and attorneys fees arising out of or caused by the use of meeting or other space, excluding any liability caused by the sole negligence of the conference host hotel or ACJS, its employees, officers, volunteers, and representatives. This includes participation in events held at the Annual Meeting where alcohol is served.

Linking Teaching, Practice, and Research in the Academy



Greetings, colleagues, friends, and fellow ACJS Members! Welcome to the 54th annual meeting of ACJS housed in the Kansas City Marriott Downtown. I also welcome you to Kansas City, Missouri ... Home of the Negro League Baseball Museum, American Jazz Museum, the college basketball experience, the WWI Museum, Hallmark, the Power & Light entertainment district, and of course KC BBQ ... just to name a few. I am indeed excited about the program that we have planned for this meeting.

There are lots of great things to do here in KC and in keeping with the conference theme, there are solid collaborations going on between practitioners and the academic community. The KC Police have teamed up with Dr. Ken Novak and his colleagues at the University of Missouri, Kansas City as well as the local prosecutor and the mayor on the "Kansas City No Violence Alliance" (NoVA) and they are working collaboratively on a Smart Policing Initiative project implementing hot spots in violent areas of the city. A good use of science-based research helping front line practitioners.

Our 2017 program chairs Nancy Marion (U. Akron) and Will Oliver (Sam Houston), and the entire program committee have tirelessly worked put together what I think is an excellent and inclusive program. There is room at the table for all credible ideas to develop and flourish. The inclusive nature of ACJS makes it the right venue to include all voices in these conversations, and now is the right time to bring these diverse perspectives together. It is my hope that the ideas, discussions, and debates cultivated here in Kansas City will blossom into collaborative ventures that include many more voices in the discussion. Let's move forward in our efforts to link teaching, practice, and research in criminal justice.

You may also note that there is also an increase in participation from community colleges and teaching institutions. If you are new to the Academy then a **big hearty welcome to you!** If you are a regular attendee of ACJS meetings then welcome to the 54th! The Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences was originally created by a few police scholars interested in providing an open and welcoming environment for both academics and practitioners where fresh ideas and research might be exchanged and applied for the betterment of our communities, practice and scholarship. Since that time the Academy has grown to one of the premier organizations representing a diverse group of scholars from all sectors of the discipline (police, corrections, courts/law, theory, victimology, juvenile justice, violence prevention, critical criminology, green criminal justice, etc.), practitioners and student members from all regions of the country and including many international members.

It is with that background in mind that ACJS President Lorenzo Boyd, his Program Co-Chairs (Nancy Marion and Will Oliver), the 2017 Program Committee, the ACJS Executive Board, countless other volunteers who chair panels and run committees, sections and organize events at the meeting, along with Association Manager Cathy Barth and myself have created a **conference with you the attendee in mind**. We hope that you will enjoy what is available and feel free to give us feedback on what you experience either directly or in the survey you will have the opportunity to complete after the conference is complete.

Note: If you are interested in becoming a trained program reviewer you must first get approval of the ACJS Executive Board and then undergo training by the Academy. Certification standards and related information are also available for your review on the ACJS website at www.acjs.org or you might want to contact the chair of the Academic Review Committee (ARC): Dr. Robert Jerin at rajerin@endicott.edu for more information about certification, program review or technical assistance.

Besides the “work” of the conference – the panels, presentations, workshops, and roundtables – please also be sure to stop in at the **section and regional business meetings** and their respective events (notably ACJS will again sponsor the **All Regions Ice Cream Social** on Wednesday, March 22nd, from 4:30 to 5:30 pm in the Marriott Tower: Third Level Foyer. If you are new to ACJS the very best way to meet and get to know people is to participate in sections with others who have similar research and pedagogical interests, or practitioner experience, as

you! Working for the regional organizations will also lead to friendships which can be reviewed not just at ACJS, but at a regional meeting. Students should not hesitate to join the sections and regions as well, as these connections are vital to your professional or scholarly growth. ACJS friends are often made by volunteering to do work for regions and the sections and by serving on the various committees who oil the machine of ACJS.

Also check out the **book vendors** in the Exhibit Hall (Muehlebach Tower: Floor Main Level Lobby - Imperial/Colonial Ballrooms). We are indebted to several publishers for their support over the years, including their sponsorship of events and food for attendees. Of particular note is **Sage's** continued sponsorship of the **Professional Development Teaching Workshop** for new faculty or advanced doctoral students on both Tuesday and Wednesday (pre-registration is required). Certification for Academic Programs

The goal of the ACJS Certification Standards and implementing a Certification Review process is to measurably improve the quality of criminal justice education. For several years, ACJS had Minimum Standards for Criminal Justice Education and these standards were used in a peer review process through ACJS Academic Review. The new standards and process represent an evolution from “peer review” to “certification”. The ACJS Certification is designed to evaluate evidence-based compliance with the Certification Standards.

What do we mean by compliance with standards? The ACJS Executive Board will Certify those programs that undergo ACJS Certification Review and that have demonstrated, through substantive, credible evidence, the program meets or exceeds all parts of every standard. The emphasis is on evidence, not intention. Programs are required to provide evidence of program quality & effectiveness based on program outcome assessment.

The Certification Standards are broken into nine sections, each of which has specific Standards and Recommended Indicators. The sections are:

- A: Program Mission & History
- B: Program Structure & Curriculum
- C: Faculty
- D: Admission & Articulation
- E: Resources
- F: Student Services
- G: Integrity
- H: Program Quality & Effectiveness
- I: Branch Campuses, Additional Locations, and Other Instructional Sites

The Certification Standards for Academic Programs and Process for Undergoing Review are available for Associate, Baccalaureate, and Master's degree programs. ACJS Program Participation Options

Research Showcase

The Research Showcase is a collection of visual displays of research that encourages informal interaction between authors and audience. The primary author of a Research Showcase presentation must be in attendance and committed to standing near his or her presentation throughout the allotted session.

Paper Presentations

Panels consist of four or five presenters of written papers and a panel chair. Presenters make formal presentations of completed works. The panel chair opens and closes the session and coordinates questions and comments from the audience. Participants who select this option are expected to send their finished papers to the Panel Chair two weeks prior to the conference.

Student Authored Paper Panels

Undergraduate and graduate student authors may submit their papers to a regular topical area of their choice where they will present with other faculty and practitioners. However, students have the option to submit their papers for presentation on an all-student panel. These panels are on a variety of topical areas, and are designed to facilitate initial presentations in a supportive and welcoming environment. Participants who select this option are expected to send their finished papers to the Panel Chair two weeks prior to the conference. Students who select this option should select "*student panel*" as their topic area.

Complete Panels

A complete panel consists of coordinating the arrangement of four papers related to a common theme. The person facilitating the complete panel must include a panel chair, panel title, and four papers with all supporting information for the papers at the time of submission to the website. Participants involved in this option are expected to send their finished papers to the Panel Chair two weeks prior to the conference.

Roundtables

Roundtables are open discussions of a topic, organized by a moderator and involving no more than four individual discussants with special knowledge or expertise in the topic area. No formal papers are presented. Often the discussion concerns diverse viewpoints or findings in a topic area.

Open Seminars

An open seminar involves one or more presenters speaking on more practical educational issues such as seeking extramural research funding, the job search process, developing course syllabi, or entering university administration. Open seminars can also be hands-on experiences that involve the audience as participants (e.g., mock job interviews, victim-offender mediation). An Open Seminar is in a different format than a roundtable panel because there are no discussants and no scholarly papers presented. All Open Seminars are open to all conference participants with no advance registration required.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

The ACJS Nominations and Elections Committee is soliciting nominations for the following Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences offices: Second Vice President, Trustee-At-Large, and Region Four Trustee. All candidates for office must be regular ACJS members in good standing. The individuals who are elected will take office at the Friday 2018 ACJS Executive Board Meeting.

The person elected to the office of Second Vice President will have a four-year term of office on the ACJS Executive Board and will hold the offices of Second Vice President, First Vice President, President, and Immediate Past President in turn. The person elected to the office of Trustee-at-Large will have a three-year term. The person elected to a Regional Trustee position will have a three-year term. Only current ACJS Regular members holding professional employment affiliation in the Region and having been a member of the respective regional association for at least one full year immediately prior to being nominated or petitioning may run for the respective Trustee position. Region Four includes the states Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas.

Individuals seeking ACJS office may achieve candidacy by either petition or nomination. Those nominating individuals for ACJS office are expected to contact the nominee to ensure that the nominee is willing to run for the office in question. An ACJS member seeking an office via petition must obtain seventy-five (75) signatures of Regular ACJS members in good standing. The petition must state the name and complete address of the candidate, e-mail address, home and office phone numbers, and the office the candidate is seeking. To facilitate verification, the petition must also include the clearly printed name, signature, and institutional affiliation or address of each ACJS member signing it and the signature date. More than one petition form may be submitted on behalf of a specific candidate.

Chester L. Britt, III

Chester L. Britt, III, 54 of Ames, passed away Aug. 30, 2016, at Israel Family Hospice in Ames.

Chet Britt was born July 22, 1962, to Chester Lamont and Lilia (Colley) Britt, II in Santa Monica, Calif. Chester graduated from Workman High School in City of Industry, Calif. He met Kelly Champion at Arizona State University in 2001 and they were married May 19, 2007, in Phoenix.

Chet earned a B.S. in 1984 from the University of Iowa with Honors in Sociology, a M.A. in Sociology in 1986 from Washington State University, and a Ph.D in Sociology in 1990 from the University of Arizona. He was appointed an Assistant Professor in the Department of Sociology, at the University of Illinois from 1990-95. His second appointment as an Assistant Professor was at Pennsylvania State University from 1995-99. He held the position of Associate Professor at Arizona State University from 1999-2006, and at Northeastern University from 2006-11. He achieved the rank of full Professor at Northeastern University in 2011, which he held until 2015, when he accepted his most recent position at Iowa State University in 2015. His administrative responsibilities have included Chair, Department of Criminal Justice and Criminology, Arizona State University, 2003-06, Associate Dean for the Undergraduate Program, College of Criminal Justice, Northeastern University, 2006-08, Interim Dean, College of Criminal Justice, Northeastern University, 2008-10, Dean, School of Criminology and Criminal Justice, Northeastern University, 2010-15, and Chair, Department of Sociology, Iowa State University, 2015 to the present. He was also a Visiting Scholar, School of Political and Social Inquiry, Monash University (Australia) during June of 2012.

Chet's awards and honors include selection for Phi Beta Kappa in 1984, Honors Pass, Crime and Deviance Preliminary Exam in 1987, Graduate Research Fellowship, National Institute of Justice in 1989, Faculty Recognition Award, Research and Graduate Studies Office, Pennsylvania State University in 1997, and a Faculty Recognition Award, Research and Graduate Studies Office, Pennsylvania State University in 1998.

His fields of interest were Criminological theory; Demography of crime, criminal careers, and victimization; Criminal justice decision-making; and Quantitative research methods. His books include Control Theories of Crime and Delinquency: Advances in Criminological Theory, Volume 12 by Chester L. Britt and Michael Gottfredson (Editors), 2003; and Statistics in Criminal Justice, 4th ed. by David Weisburd and Chester L. Britt, 2014. His wide array of other work includes publications in journals, book chapters, proceedings from conferences and symposiums, book reviews, funded

research, invited presentations, dissertation committees, professional service in the institutions that he worked in and the field of Criminology and Criminal Justice, as well as community service. Chet's professional memberships included the American Society of Criminology, the Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences, and the American Sociological Association.

Chet was a member of First Church of Somerville in Somerville, Mass., and was a fan the Boston Red Sox and the Los Angeles Angels, and a huge fan of the Iowa Hawkeyes. He loved being a dad, spending time with his family and making his wife have time for fun.

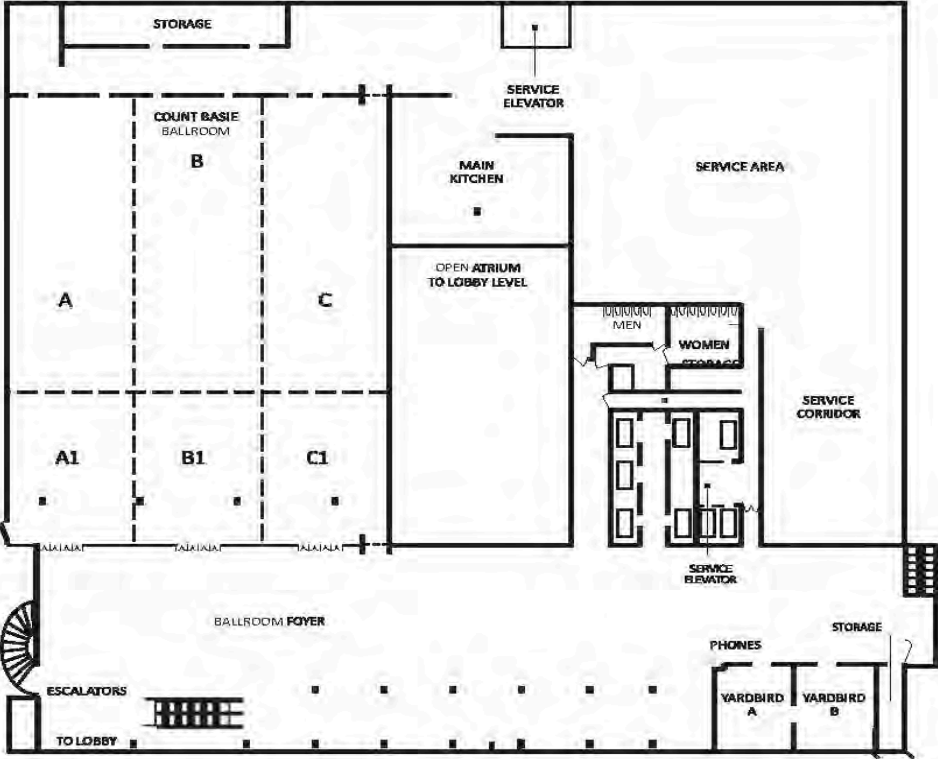

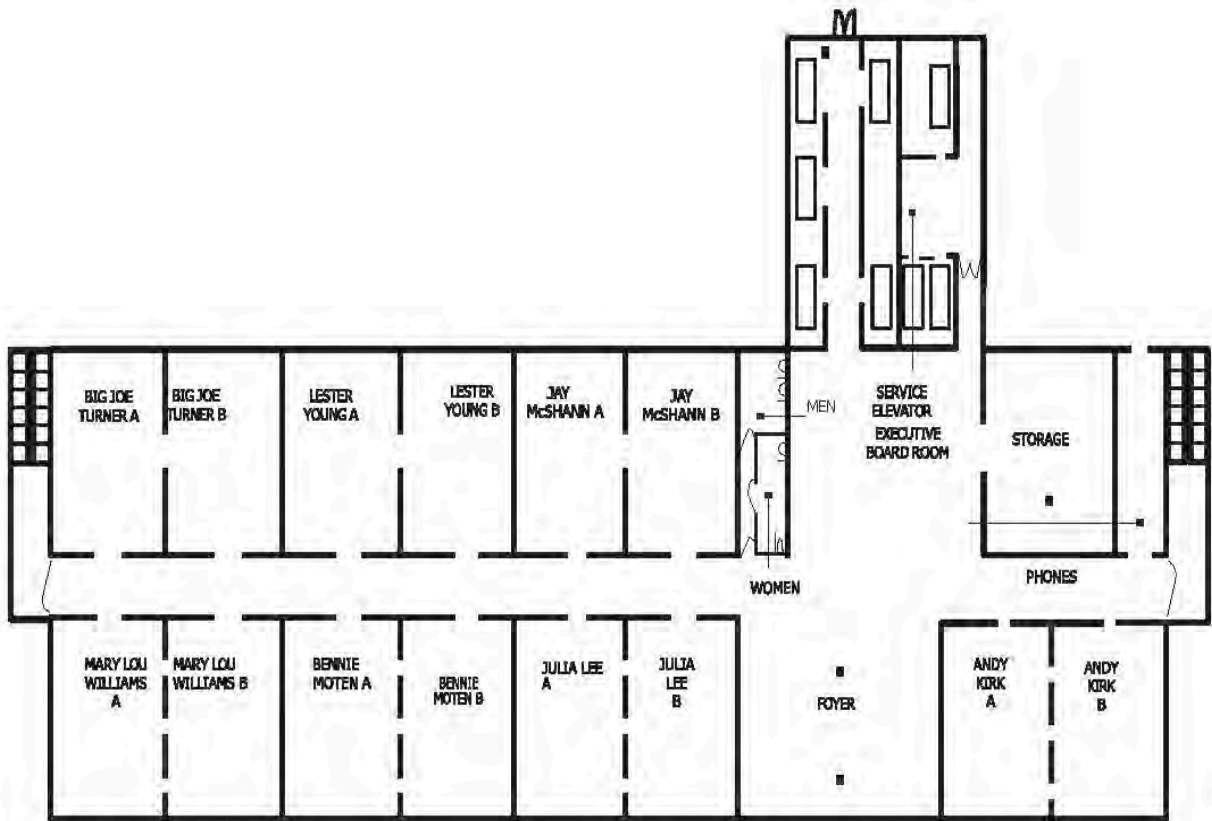

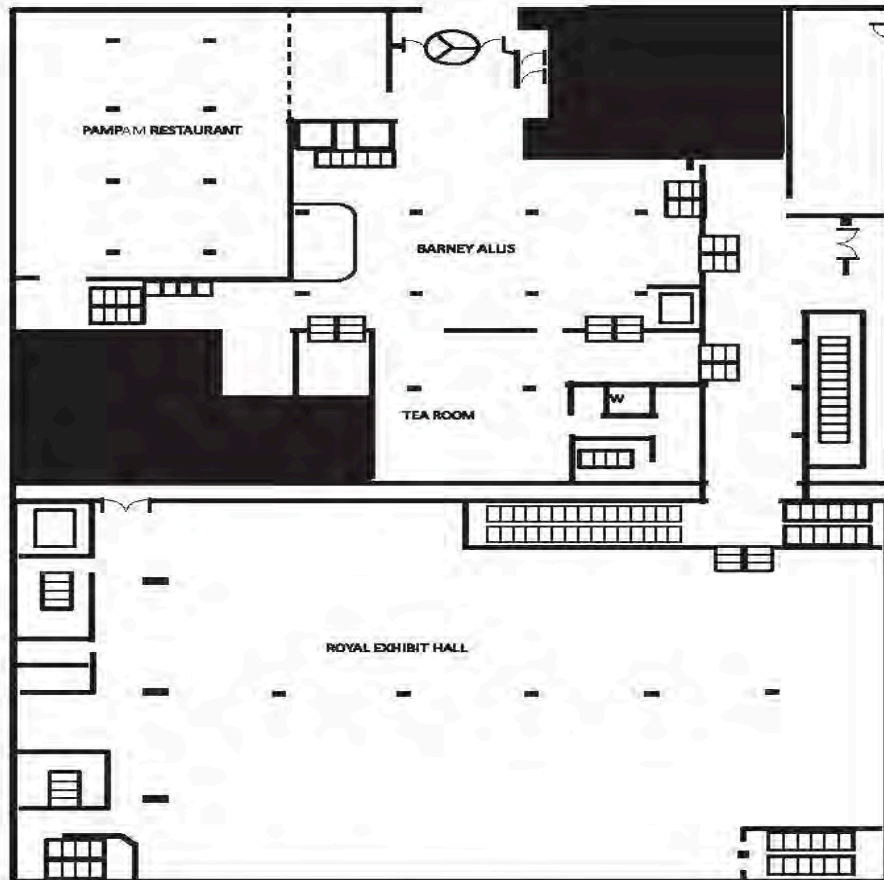

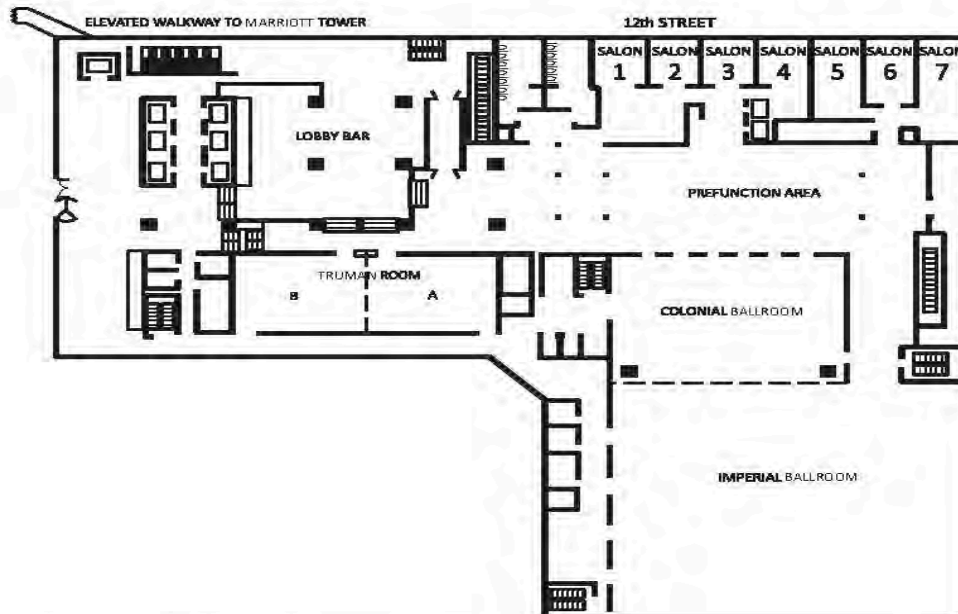

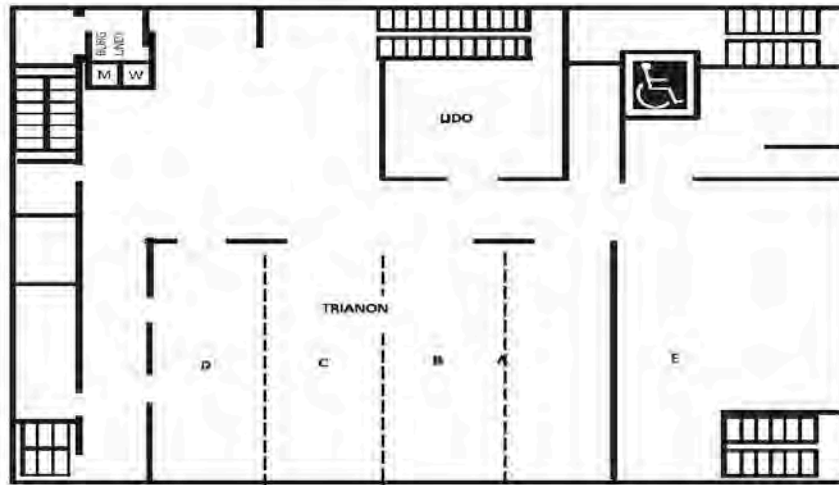

ACJS 2017 EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE

The ACJS Employment Exchange (EE), located in Muehlebach Tower: Floor Main Level Lobby - Truman A will open on Wednesday, March 22, 2017, from 12:00 pm to 5:00 pm. On Thursday, March 23, and Friday, March 24, the EE will open from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. The EE will not be open on Saturday.

In keeping with the desire to **GO GREEN**, no longer is it necessary to send hard copies of position announcements or candidate vita. Building on the success of the EE at ACJS 2013, due in no small part to the assistance provided by ACJS Manager Cathy Barth, the EE will provide laptops containing “Job Openings” as well as “Job Candidates” to accommodate ACJS EE attendees. Hiring institutions need to send 1) full announcement and 2) brief description of the position (for “**position-at-a-glance**”; see below for details), and job candidates need to send their vitae by attachment to JLee@psu.edu.

For easy indexing in our email system, hiring institutions should use “ACJSJOBOPENING” as their email title, and job candidates should use “ACJSJOBCANDIDATE” as their email title. There is no cutoff date; the EE will maintain a rolling enrollment. However, for best results, institutions or persons wishing to post to the EE are advised to email the announcement or listing at least one week prior to the Annual Meeting. Submissions will continue to be accepted by bringing the announcements or candidate CV to the EE on a flash drive. Those working in the EE will be happy to copy announcements and candidate listings to the proper set of laptops. The EE will operate three laptops for position searches and two computers for candidate searches. Internet access will NOT be available on these laptops.

At any given time during the EE program, at least two EE representatives will be on-site. The EE representatives will be graduate students from across the country that have volunteered their services to ACJS. EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE Ribbons below their nametags will easily identify them.

Along with the position announcements, hiring institutions are recommended to submit brief summary memos, called “**position-at-a-glance**,” containing 1) school name 2) specialty areas (e.g., policing, theory, corrections, generalist), 3) position type (e.g., instructor, tenure-track assistant, associate), and 4) contact information of the representative available during the ACJS Annual Meeting. The EE will organize the memos and beam them on a wall screen using a projector. Job candidates will be advised to glance at it for quick reference, and then go to the position announcement to see if they wish to contact the representative(s) attending the conference.

Hiring institution representatives should bring their own **table banner**. The banners should be in an acceptable fashion without 1) poor graphic design, 2) overwhelming colors with unidentifiable school names, or 3) nothing but acronyms of the institution. Institutions are asked to be conscientious and check with their own faculty members before bringing a banner to the ACJS EE program.

Tables and chairs will be available for institutions and candidates to use for employment-related meetings, and they will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Institutions

have been asked to determine in advance their interview schedule (i.e., who will be available on what days and at what times). Interview sign-up sheets will be made available for posting on a **self-service basis**.

Panels

A Panel consists of four or five presenters of written papers and a panel chair. Presenters make formal presentations of completed works. The Panel chair opens and closes the session and coordinates questions and comments from the audience.

Author Meets Critics

Open Seminar

An Open Seminar involves one or more presenters on more practical educational opportunities on such topics as looking for funding, grant writing, finding a job, developing course syllabi, or becoming a new department chair. Open seminars can also be hands-on experiences that involve the audience as participants, such as mock job interviews or victim offender mediations. An Open Seminar is in a different format than a roundtable or panel, because there are no discussants and no scholarly papers presented. All Open Seminars are open to all conference participants with no advance registration required.

Research and Pictorial Showcase

The Research and Pictorial Showcase is a collection of visual displays of research that encourages informal interaction between authors and audience.

Aim 4 Peace Violence Prevention Program

Aim4Peace (Aim for Peace) is a public health approach to reduce shootings and homicides. Aim4Peace uses highly-trained violence interrupters and outreach staff, public education campaigns, Neighborhood Action Teams and community mobilization to reverse the violence epidemic in Kansas City, Missouri. Aim4Peace focuses on the neighborhood factors that most often contribute to violence, helping those who are considered at highest risk of committing offenses due to their living or employment situation.

The Aim4Peace program began in 2008 and was originally based on the Ceasefire: Stop the Shooting project in Chicago. Though Aim4Peace currently focuses on the Police Department's East Patrol Division, with continued success the plan will be implemented throughout the City. Aim4Peace is committed to making neighborhoods safer.

Making the No Return Investment

Established in 2009, it is the mission of the Reentry and Resources work group to identify resources for people with a criminal background, enhance efforts to ensure successful reentry, reduce recidivism and enhance public safety. This work group achieves these goals through collaborative partnerships with government agencies, faith-based organizations, career centers and all other stakeholders.

In 2015 Reentry & Resources became a local non-profit that provides referrals for service and financial assistance to returning citizens and those who are on probation. Our group also conducts activities, trainings, and presentations to raise awareness in our communities in hopes of decreasing the stigma associated with criminal backgrounds. Our group aids in lowering the unemployment rate of citizens negatively impacted by a felony background. Our services improve our community by improving a returning citizen's opportunities for success.

Reentry & Resources is operated by volunteers from our communities.

Reentry Simulation

Ninety-five percent of the over 1.5 million incarcerated individuals in the United States will eventually be released back into the community (West & Sabol, 2009; ACA, 2013). Of those, approximately 65% will reoffend and return to prison within 3 years of release (BOP, 2013). Communities all across the country are affected: as a victim, a tax-payer, a family member, or a community resource.

While offenders are released to diverse communities with differing levels of support and intrinsic motivation, experience suggests that they share many of the same challenges. This Reentry Simulation will illustrate the journey to self-sufficiency and the barriers that may contribute to feelings of helplessness and decreased self-efficacy. Participants will assume the identity of an ex-offender and perform tasks in four 15 minute sessions with each session representing a week. By the end of this workshop participants will have simulated a month in the life of someone who has released from prison. Participants will encounter the same challenges faced by many ex-offenders as they try to complete their court ordered obligations as well as maintain their day to day life. This simulation suggests that, ultimately, the ability to navigate "the system" may be a primary factor in the relationship between resiliency and recidivism.
