Pursuant to the ACJS Code of Ethics and ACJS Policies, all ACJS Annual Meeting attendees should be aware of the following:



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences Annual Meeting Attendees,

If you are new to the Academy then a big hearty **welcome to you!** If you are a regular attendee of ACJS meetings then welcome to the 53rd! The Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences was originally created by a few police scholars interested in providing an open and welcoming environment for both academics and practitioners where fresh ideas and research might be exchanged and applied for the betterment of our communities, practice and scholarship. Since that time the Academy has grown to be one of the premier Criminal Justice/Criminology organizations in the country representing a diverse group of scholars, practitioners and student members from all regions of the country and including many international members too. This year's meeting promises to be one of the largest ever (last year in Orlando we broke attendance records and this year, at the time of this writing in early January, the hotel rooms were booking fast), with 446 events planned for this three and a half day conference.

ACJS President Brandon Applegate, his Program Chairs (Shelley Listwan and Jennifer Hartman), the 2016 Program Committee, the ACJS Executive Board, countless other volunteers who chair panels and run committees, sections and organize events at the meeting, along with Association Manager Cathy Barth and myself, have created a **conference with you in mind**. As a result more programs/departments have initiated the certification process. If you are in a department or program which is interested in being certified by the Academy, consider attending the sessions, titled "Open Seminar: Technical Assistance, Program Review, and Program Certification – What You Need to Know," where the changes in the certification standards will be discussed: Wednesday, March 30 from 2:00 – 3:15 p.m., EVENT #109, Plaza Court 1 and Thursday, March 31 from 9:30 – 10:45 a.m., EVENT #194, Plaza Court 2. If you are interested in becoming a trained program reviewer you must first get approval of the ACJS Executive Board and then undergo training by the Academy. This year that training is scheduled for Thursday, March 31 from 12:30 – 4:45 p.m., EVENT #260, Terrace/Tower. Certification standards and related information are also available for your review on the ACJS website at www.acjs.org or you might want to contact the chair of the Academic Review Committee, Dr. Barbara Peat at bpeat@iun.edu, for more information about certification.

Besides the "work" of the conference – the panels, presentations, workshops, and roundtables – please also be sure to stop in at the **section and regional business meetings** and their respective events (notably ACJS will again sponsor the **All Regions Ice Cream Social** in the Plaza Foyer on Wednesday, from 4:30–5:30). If you are new to ACJS, the very best way to meet and get to know people is to participate in sections with others who have similar research and pedagogical interests, or practitioner experience, as you! Working for the regional

organizations will also lead to friendships which can be renewed not just at ACJS, but at a regional meeting. Students should not hesitate to join the sections and regions as well, as these connections are vital to your professional or scholarly growth. ACJS friends are often made by volunteering to do work for the regions and the sections and by serving on the various committees who oil the machine of ACJS.

Also check out the **book vendors** in the Exhibit Hall (Plaza Ballroom A/B/C). We are indebted to several publishers for their support over the years, including their sponsorship of events and food for attendees. - Police: The Police Section strives to build networks among police practitioners, researchers, and educators.
- Restorative and Community Justice: The mission of the organization is to: provide a professional arena for academics, educators, justice agency practitioners, and victim advocates interested in developing restorative and community justice theory; conduct policy-relevant research on restorative and community justice practices; and educate individuals, organizations, institutions, and governmental entities about restorative and community justice principles and practices.
- Security and Crime Prevention: The Security and Crime Prevention Section's primary mission is to promote the professional growth and development of its members through service and education to the academic and practical field of security.
- ◆ Teaching, Learning, and Scholarship: The purpose of this section is to bring together Academy members to serve as a multifaceted resource to assist faculty, practitioners, students, administrators, and concerned citizens in their integration of innovative and effective teaching and learning techniques, and the scholarship of teaching within the field of criminal justice education and training.
- Victimology: The Victimology Section focuses on crime victimization, interpersonal violence, child maltreatment, and trauma and victim services.

The new standards and process represent an evolution from "peer review" to "certification". The ACJS Certification is designed to evaluate evidence-based compliance with the Certification Standards.

What do we mean by compliance with standards? The ACJS Executive Board will Certify those programs that undergo ACJS Certification Review and that have demonstrated, through substantive, credible evidence, the program meets or exceeds all parts of every standard. <u>The emphasis is on evidence, not intention.</u> Programs are required to provide evidence of program quality & effectiveness based on program outcome assessment.

The Certification Standards are broken into nine sections, each of which has specific Standards and Recommended Indicators. The sections are:

- > A: Program Mission & History
- B: Program Structure & Curriculum
- C: Faculty
- D: Admission & Articulation
- E: Resources
- F: Student Services
- ➤ G: Integrity
- ▶ H: Program Quality & Effectiveness
- > I: Branch Campuses, Additional Locations, and Other Instructional Sites

LCD projectors will be available in the meeting rooms. No laptops/computers or overhead projectors will be provided. Additional audio/video equipment is the responsibility of the presenter. Individuals wanting additional equipment must either bring their own equipment to the conference or make arrangements through the hotel for equipment rental.

ACJS Program Participation Options

Research Showcase

The Research Showcase is a collection of visual displays of research that encourages informal interaction between authors and audience. The primary author of a Research Showcase presentation must be in attendance and committed to standing near his or her presentation throughout the allotted session.

Paper Presentations

Panels consist of four or five presenters of written papers and a panel chair. Presenters make formal presentations of completed works. The panel chair opens and closes the session and coordinates questions and comments from the audience. Participants who select this option are expected to send their finished papers to the Panel Chair two weeks prior to the conference.

Student Authored Paper Panels

Undergraduate and graduate student authors may submit their papers to a regular topical area of their choice where they will present with other faculty and practitioners. However, students have the option to submit their papers for presentation on an all-student panel. These panels are on a variety of topical areas, and are designed to facilitate initial presentations in a supportive and welcoming environment. Participants who select this option are expected to send their finished papers to the Panel Chair two weeks prior to the conference. Students who select this option should select "student panel" as their topic area.

Complete Panels

A complete panel consists of coordinating the arrangement of four papers related to a common theme. The person facilitating the complete panel must include a panel chair, panel title, and four papers with all supporting information for the papers at the time of submission to the website. Participants involved in this option are expected to send their finished papers to the Panel Chair two weeks prior to the conference.

Roundtables

Roundtables are open discussions of a topic, organized by a moderator and involving no more than four individual discussants with special knowledge or expertise in the topic area. No formal papers are presented. Often the discussion concerns diverse viewpoints or findings in a topic area.

Open Seminars

An open seminar involves one or more presenters speaking on more practical educational issues such as seeking extramural research funding, the job search process, developing course syllabi, or entering university administration. Open seminars can also be hands-on experiences that involve the audience as participants (e.g., mock job interviews, victim-offender mediation). An Open Seminar is in a different format than a roundtable panel because there are no discussants and no scholarly papers presented. All Open Seminars are open to all conference participants with no advance registration required.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

The ACJS Nominations and Elections Committee is soliciting nominations for the following Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences offices: Second Vice President, Treasurer, Trustee-At-Large, Region Two Trustee, and Region Three Trustee. All candidates for office must be regular ACJS members in good standing. The individuals who are elected will take office at the Friday 2017 ACJS Executive Board Meeting.

The person elected to the office of Second Vice President will have a four-year term of office on the ACJS Executive Board and will hold the offices of Second Vice President, First Vice President, President, and Immediate Past President in turn. The person elected to the office of Treasuer will have a three-year term. The person elected to the office of Trustee-at-Large will have a three-year term. Only current ACJS Regular members holding professional employment affiliation in the Region and having been a member of the respective regional association for at least one full year immediately prior to being nominated or petitioning may run for the respective Trustee position. Individuals seeking ACJS office may achieve candidacy by either petition or nomination. Individuals who use the petition process automatically secure candidacy, as long as the petitions are deemed to meet the minimum number of signatures required. Individuals who are nominated for office shall compete for placement on the slate via review by the Nominations and Elections Committee, which will make a recommendation to the ACJS Executive Board regarding the final slate of candidates.

Those nominating individuals for ACJS office are expected to contact the nominee to ensure that the nominee is willing to run for the office in question. An ACJS member seeking an office via petition must obtain seventy-five (75) signatures of Regular ACJS members in good standing. The petition must state the name and complete address of the candidate, e-mail address, home and office phone numbers, and the office the candidate is seeking. IN MEMORIAM

Charles Chastain

The field of criminal justice has lost another of its founding greats. Charles Chastain was diagnosed with multiple cancers the first week of June and died just two days later. Charles served the Department of Criminal Justice at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock from his arrival as an assistant professor to retirement, serving over 20 years as chair. Charles was one of the very earliest adoptees of the LEAA effort to develop criminal justice degrees and provide an education for police, corrections and others in the criminal justice system. He was a very vocal supporter of criminal justice studies as a liberal arts education that had the potential to transform people, both within and outside the justice system, though a broader understanding of the workings of crime, justice, and politics in the U.S. Through his efforts, he established the criminal justice bachelor of arts at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock in 1972. Soon thereafter, he established the master of arts program in criminal justice. In both of these, he insisted on an arts designation rather than the more popular science designation because he felt criminal justice students should be exposed to the arts, languages, and philosophies of a liberal arts education. The number of people Charles touched and changed through interaction with him is immeasurable. He helped form the philosophies of several heads of the Arkansas Department of Correction, and many police chiefs, police officers, probation officers, and others. He touched the early academic lives of many people who are now lawyers and professors, including offering an adjunct teaching position to a young Bill Clinton. Charles was also a strong supporter of people in prison. He started a program to collect books from people to build libraries in prisons throughout Arkansas. He was one of the first people to become involved in the Inside-Out program in prisons because he wanted to show students that those in prison were much the same as them with some different life experiences and to show those in prison the potential for future success through education. Charles was also a believer in the academic associations, having been President of the Southwestern Association of Criminal Justice and a board member of the Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences. For me, Charles believed in me when many graduate schools would not. He was a mentor, confident, and friend for over 25 years. I feel as I have lost a father. I am sure all those Charles touched feel the same. We have lost one of the greats.

Bernadette Palombo



Bernadette Marie Jones-Palombo, professor of Criminal Justice and, recently, director of General Studies at LSU in Shreveport, entered eternal rest and peace on April 11, 2015, at her home in Shreveport, La., following a lengthy battle with multiple forms of cancer. A celebration of her remarkable life was held on Friday, April 17, at 10 a.m. at Rose-Neath Funeral Home's Marshall Street Chapel, Deacon Homer Tucker of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Catholic Church, officiating.

Dr. Jones-Palombo was born on August 10, 1949, to Elva Clementine and Gilbert Francis Jones of Pittsburgh, Pa., and was one of five children. Her siblings include Gilbert Francis Jr., Lawrence, and James of Pittsburgh, and David of Pompano Beach, Fla.

She married Michael Anthony Palombo and they had one child, Dominic, her beloved "Domenico," and their spirits are now reunited. Her two grandsons, Nino and Nico, of Chevy Chase, MD, remain to carry the family legacy. Her dying wish, which was unfulfilled, was to see her grandchildren and let them know of her great love for them.

Dr. Jones-Palombo graduated from Domenec High School in Pittsburgh and earned a bachelor's degree in Political Studies from Pitzer College in Claremont, Calif. She received her master's degree in Criminal Justice from the Center for Politics and Economics at Claremont University and received a Ph.D. in Political Sciences from the same center at Claremont.

She arrived at Louisiana State University, Shreveport (LSUS) in 1995 to lead a prestigious grant on Community Oriented Policing and received her 20-year pin shortly before her death. Although she was noted for community policing, her research was eclectic, including teaching evaluations, gang theory and white collar crime, to name only a few.

Throughout her career she was dedicated not only to her academic field but to two professional organizations, the Academy of Community Justice Sciences and the American Society of Criminology. She was a member of Alpha Phi Sigma national criminal justice honor society. Her commitment to professional organizations was reflected in the number of students she encouraged to participate in them, particularly Lambda Sigma Upsilon Chapter of Alpha Phi Sigma at LSUS.

Interested and involved in her community, Dr. Jones-Palombo was proud of her membership in League of Women Voters, an organization she served as Louisiana vice president from 2003 to 2007.

For seven years, Dr. Jones-Palombo served as the chairman of the Department of History and Social Science (2008-2014), working during difficult economic times to assure quality educational resources for the students in the department.

An accomplished and devoted educator, she penned numerous articles and was author, editor or coeditor of "Academic Professionalism in Law Enforcement," (which was one of the initial studies of gender in law enforcement), "Provision of the Right to Counsel in Caddo Parish," and "Wicked Shreveport."

In 2004, Dr, Jones-Palombo was named to Who's Who Among American Teachers. This is a testament to her unswerving dedication to students and to her profession. Her life as an educator assures that, although she is no longer here, her legacy remains in all whom she influenced.

An optimistic spirit and focus on the future allowed Bernadette Jones-Palombo to live far beyond what was expected and gave her a sense of hope. That optimism was reflected by her request to be placed on this summer's teaching schedule at LSUS.

A nurturer by nature with a kind a loving heart, she leaves a host of friends and students who join her family in mourning her passing. The family thanks Dr. Marianne Fisher-Giorlando, Grambling State University, retired, Kim Jensen, a friend and colleague at LSUS, and Willis-Knighton Hospice nurse, Tristy, as well as her physician, Dr. Chip McDonald.

RETAIL MARIJUANA IN COLORADO INFO FOR VISITORS

Now that retail marijuana is legal in Colorado, we all have a few things to know.

LAWS OVERVIEW

BUYING OR SELLING MARIJUANA

Must be 21.

It is illegal for people under 21 to buy, have or use retail marijuana. It is a felony for adults to give, sell or share marijuana with anyone under 21.

Only buy from licensed retail stores.

From Colorado?

Colorado residents 21 years and older can buy up to one ounce of retail marijuana at a time.

From out-of-state?

Non-residents can buy up to 1/4 ounce of retail marijuana.

Do not sell it.

It is illegal to sell marijuana if you are not a licensed retailer.

USING OR HAVING MARIJUANA

No more than 1 ounce.

Adults age 21 and older may have up to 1 ounce of marijuana. Having more may result in legal charges or fines.

Illegal to use in public.

No matter how you use marijuana - smoked, eaten, or vaped- it is not allowed in public places.

This includes:

Outdoor spaces like national and local parks, ski resorts, concert venues and indoor areas like restaurants and bars.

Check hotel or vacation rental policies.

Many properties do not allow smoking of any kind in private rooms, hallways, patios or porches. Policies may be different, so check before you use.

GETTING AROUND COLORADO

Do not drive high.

It is illegal to drive under the influence of marijuana and you can get a DUI.

Do not use in a car.

It is illegal to use marijuana or have open packages in a car. Additionally, rental car companies may charge fees if the car smells like marijuana.

Keep it in Colorado.

It is illegal to take marijuana out of the state or to Denver International Airport. Dispose of unwanted marijuana before leaving the state.

Unwanted marijuana?

Trash unwanted marijuana where no one can see it, like in a large dumpster or sealed in an empty jar and thrown out. Do not leave leftover marijuana in hotel rooms or rental cars when you go home.



TIPS FOR SAFE AND RESPONSIBLE USE



DRIVING WHILE HIGH MAY DOUBLE YOUR RISK OF A CRASH.

Marijuana makes driving more dangerous because it slows your reaction time and makes it harder to tell distances.

Wait at least 6 hours after smoking or at least 8 hours after eating/drinking marijuana before driving, biking, skiing or doing other activities.



DO NOT MIX MARIJUANA AND ALCOHOL.

Using alcohol and marijuana at the same time is more dangerous than using either alone.



BE CAREFUL IF YOU TAKE MEDICATION.

There may be drug interactions between marijuana and your medication.



START SLOW.

A single 10 mg serving of THC is likely enough to hurt your ability to drive, bike or do other activities, especially for occasional users.

While you quickly feel the effects from smoked or vaped marijuana, edibles can take up to 4 hours to take full effect. Start with less than one serving and wait before using more.



STORE IT SAFELY.

Marijuana products can be confused for regular food or candy.

Store all marijuana products in a locked area. Make sure children cannot see or reach the locked area. Keep marijuana in the child-resistant packaging from the store.

Ask the marijuana retailer for more information if you are not sure about how to use a product safely and responsibly.

SOME PEOPLE SHOULD NOT USE MARIJUANA.

Pregnant or breastfeeding women should not use marijuana since it can harm their baby.

Young people should protect their growing brain by not using marijuana.

CONSIDER LONG-TERM EFFECTS.

Marijuana can hurt your memory, even a week after using.

HAVING A BAD TIME?

If you are worried that you or someone else used too much marijuana, call the poison control hotline as soon as possible. Calling is free and you will get help quickly: 1-800-222-1222. If symptoms seem bad, call 911 or go to an emergency room right away.

Calling for help in case of any drug or alcohol emergency can save lives. Colorado law protects people from some criminal charges, such as low level drug possession and use charges or minor in possession, if they call 911 or seek help for a medical emergency. Stay with the person and cooperate with police and emergency medical responders.




Keynote Speakers: Our keynote speaker and Presidential feature speakers are identified here.









ACJS 2016 EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE

The ACJS Employment Exchange (EE), located in Governor's Square 17 will open on Wednesday, March 30, 2016, at 12:00 pm and close at 5:00 pm. On Thursday, March 31, and Friday, April 1, the EE will open from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. The EE will not be open on Saturday.

In keeping with the desire to GO GREEN, no longer is it necessary to send hard copies of position announcements or candidate vita. Building on the success of the EE at ACJS 2013, due in no small part to the assistance provided by ACJS Manager Cathy Barth, the EE will provide laptops containing "Job Openings" as well as "Job Candidates" to accommodate ACJS EE attendees as well as numerous other innovations. Hiring institutions need to send 1) full announcement and 2) brief description of the position ("position-at-a-glance"; see below for details), and job candidates need to send their vitae by attachment to JLee@psu.edu.

For easy indexing in our email system, hiring institutions should use "ACJSJOBOPENING" as their email title, and job candidates should use "ACJSJOBCANDIDATE" as their email title. There is no cutoff date; the EE will maintain a rolling enrollment. However, for best results, institutions or persons wishing to post to the EE are advised to email the announcement or listing at least one week prior to the Annual Meeting. Submissions will continue to be accepted by bringing the announcements or candidate listing to the EE on a flash drive. Those working in the EE will be happy to copy announcements and candidate listings to the proper set of laptops. Internet access will NOT be available on these laptops.

The EE will operate three laptops for position searches. There will be a folder on the desktop screen, and the list of institutions will be in a document file format. Job candidates can open the files to confirm the position announcements. Job candidates may browse the announcements and save files to their own flash drive.

The EE will operate two computers for candidate searches. There will be a folder on the desktop screen containing individual candidate vitae. The files will be indexed by name and specialties listed by the candidate(s). Hiring institution representatives may browse the profiles and can save the files in their own flash drives. The Internet access is NOT available on these laptops. Those seeking candidates for positions may browse the vitae and save files to their own flash drives.

At any given time during the EE program, at least two EE representatives will be on-site. The EE representatives will be graduate students from across the country that have volunteered their services to ACJS. EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE Ribbons below their nametags will easily identify them.

Along with the position announcements, hiring institutions are advised to submit brief summary memos, called "**position-at-a-glance**," containing 1) school name 2) position titles (e.g., policing, theory, corrections, generalist), 3) # of positions, 4) minimum requirements, and 5) contact information of the representative available during the ACJS Annual Meeting. The EE will organize the memos and beam them on a wall screen using

a projector. Job candidates will be advised to glance at it for quick reference, and then go to the position announcement to see if they wish to contact the representative(s) attending the conference.

Hiring institution representatives should bring their own **table banner**. The banners should be in an acceptable fashion. It has been noted in the previous EE programs that some schools have had table banners with 1) poor graphic design, 2) overwhelming colors with unidentifiable school names, or 3) nothing but acronyms of the institution. Institutions are asked to be conscientious and check with their own faculty members before bringing a banner to the ACJS EE program.

Tables and chairs will be available for institutions and candidates to use for employment-related meetings, and they will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Institutions have been asked to determine in advance their interview schedule (i.e., who will be available on what days and at what times). Interview sign-up sheets will be made available for posting on a **self-service basis**.

ANNUAL MEETING PRESENTATION CATEGORIES

Panels

A Panel consists of four or five presenters of written papers and a panel chair. Presenters make formal presentations of completed works. The Panel chair opens and closes the session and coordinates questions and comments from the audience.

<u>Feature Panels</u> are panels that are likely to be of special interest to a wide audience or may feature one or more special guests.

Author Meets Critics

Author Meets Critics is a moderated discussion between the author(s) of a recent scholarly published work and three or four critics of the work's methodology and findings.

Roundtables

A Roundtable is an open discussion of a topic, organized by a moderator and involving several individual discussants with special knowledge or expertise in the topic area. Discussants can be academics, practitioners, or students. No formal papers are presented. Often the discussion concerns diverse viewpoints or findings in a topic area.

<u>Feature Roundtables</u> are roundtables of special interest to a wide audience or may feature one or more special guests.

Open Seminar

An Open Seminar involves one or more presenters on more practical educational opportunities on such topics as looking for funding, grant writing, finding a job, developing course syllabi, or becoming a new department chair. Open seminars can also be hands-on experiences that involve the audience as participants, such as mock job interviews or victim offender mediations. An Open Seminar is in a different format than a roundtable or panel, because there are no discussants and no scholarly papers presented. All Open Seminars are open to all conference participants with no advance registration required.

The Research and Pictorial Showcase is a collection of visual displays of research that encourages informal interaction between authors and audience.





Gabriel Hernandez

Gabe Hernandez has worked closely with urban community organizations mentoring youth who are categorized as at-risk, incarcerated, gang bangers, or a product of a broken family structure. His own story allows him to relate and share a different side, where there can be victory and hope. He recently moved to Colorado with his wife, Kimberly.

Born and raised in Fresno, CA., he is the middle child of 3 boys and 1 girl. He is half Hispanic and half white and the product of a single parent environment. At a young age, his father abandoned the family for drugs and alcohol. He grew up fortunate enough not to endure the worst of things even though they were very poor. Gabriel decided at a young age that he wanted to be in a gang despite the attempts of his mother to provide a stable home life and keep all her children involved in positive things. He began acting out at age 12, which led to multiple school referrals, suspensions, and eventually he became part of an illegal graffiti group. The graffiti group allowed him entry into the East Side Fresno Bulldog Gang. It was in the gang that he started to use of alcohol and drugs.

During the years of gang banging, he struggled a lot with right and wrong due to his upbringing. Drugs and alcohol allowed him to continue to walk along blurred lines and not question the morality of what he was doing. A few days after turning 18, Gabriel was arrested for assault with a deadly weapon and was incarcerated. He loved it! It was where he wanted to be to make his reputation grow. Prison followed. Not long after his release he was arrested and convicted for Carjacking, 3 counts of Kidnapping, and Robbery. While incarcerated, Gabriel became the leader of the Bulldogs Gang at his institution. After his release from prison, he violated parole numerous times. It wasn't until he was in a safety cell after being detained for severe schizophrenia following a dose of methamphetamine that sent him over the edge, he had a life changing interaction with God. He dropped out of the gang and began to pursue life and family. Unfortunately, not long after, he was under the influence of meth again. He was given the opportunity to go to a discipleship program out of town and accepted. It was there that he changed and has been clean ever since.

Eleven months after being released from prison and leaving the gang, he enrolled in Bible College to follow the path of ministry and learn the Bible in order to help others and bring life to them. In the five years it took him to receive his BA in Bible & Theology, he was able to encourage many people to seek life instead of death.

adult prisoners in Texas.
