

**Canadian Criminal Justice Association and the Academy of

**Affiliation Agreement**

This document, which has been agreed to by the CCJA and the ACJS Executive Boards, sets out the parameters of that agreement to affiliate.

- Information will be exchanged on an informal basis, including the newsletters of the respective societies and links/logos via websites and Facebook pages;
- A one page advert will be made available by each party in relevant newsletters to advertise respective annual conferences.
- Each organization, at their discretion, will feature articles about the other organization's meetings in their respective newsletters.

The following conditions will apply to this reciprocal agreement to affiliate:

1. Reciprocal agreements do not constitute a legal transaction. They are undertaken informally and in good faith between the CCJA and the ACJS.
2. Reciprocal agreements will be terminated whenever a breach of good faith occurs, or under any other circumstance in which either the CCJA Executive Board or the ACJS Executive Board decides that an agreement negatively affects their existing membership (e.g. a significant 'migration' of members from one organization to the other). Reciprocal agreements will be terminated whenever such an agreement is declared by the CCJA or the ACJS Executive Boards to reflect negatively upon CCJA's or ACJS's mission or general image.
3. Reciprocal agreements do not involve any direct or indirect exchanges of monies between the CCJA and the ACJS, though they may choose to sponsor an event or activity at the other's conference from time to time.
4. Reciprocal agreements will not involve any other mutual agreement between the CCJA and the ACJS except where this has been discussed and agreed by the CCJA's or ACJS's relevant sub-committees and ratified by its executive.

This agreement is ratified by the CCJA and the ACJS Executive Boards and signed by the Presidents of each respective organisation. The executive director of each organisation will be involved as facilitators in ensuring the long-term maintenance of these agreements and to co-ordinate practical aspects such as the exchange of information about conferences.

Links between the respective executive committees should be encouraged, in order to:

- Facilitate diplomatic exchanges;
- Facilitate international networking; and
- Share problems/solutions on a variety of criminological/criminal justice issues.






